A non-profit agency who goes out two times a month to deliver food and or hygiene products to individuals in the community. There are no questions asked and no paperwork is required.

To be added to the delivery list:

- 1. Call or Text: (716) 218-8349
- 2. Leave your name, telephone number, address, and how many people are in your home. If you need a little extra, please don't tell us "three people." Just tell us you need a little extra.
- 3. You **must** leave a message. We do not return phone calls, we do not check caller ID.
- 4. Please understand we will not be calling you back until the Sunday that we're going out. Rest assured you are on our delivery list! We do not have the volunteer power to call or text back everyone who contacts us.
- 5. On the Sunday that we're going out, you will receive a call when your driver is on their way. Drivers typically hit the road between 5-8pm.
- 6. By calling our hotline you are confirming with us, at the time of the call that you will be home during those hours.

- 7. In the event that you are not home, or are unreachable (no cell phone minutes, other issues) we will attempt to leave the food in a safe space by your front door. We cannot be responsible for food that is not handed directly to you.
- 8. If you would like a delivery again, you will need to call our number once again a few days after your delivery, and follow the same steps.
- 9. We do not automatically re-deliver. We do NOT keep records of those who we have delivered to. You will need to answer the same questions as before in order to receive a delivery.

Kids Escaping Drugs, Inc (KED) offers pro-active education, early intervention and partners with Renaissance Addiction Services, Inc (RASI) to manage the Renaissance Campus (a 62 bed rehabilitation facility for boys and girls ages 12-20 suffering from chemical dependency). The Face 2 Face program (education and early intervention) partners with area schools, organizations and businesses to provide the message of consequences for adolescent experimentation from the prospective of a relevant panelist (either a child in recovery or a parent of a child whose experimentation led to addiction (for adult panels)). Face 2 Face also includes a one-on-one early intervention program with is available for adolescents identified as experimenting and their families.

Monday – Friday 8:30 - 4:30. Later panels and interventions are available upon request. Families simply make a phone call to 716-827-9462 to reserve a 60-90 minute appointment for an early intervention. Upon arrival, KED asks families to complete a brief questionnaire so that we can report demographic information of those served to area funders.
